

Local Board Recertification

- Previous Executive Committee Action
 - Initial Designation approved March 11, 2015
- Process for recertification defined in Workforce Services Directive WSD15-13, issued January 22, 2016
- Recertification required under Section 107 of Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) (due to State 3/30/2016, signed by BOS and submitted by no later than 6/20/2016)
 - Requires Governor to certify one Local Board for each Local Area once every two years.
- Requirements for recertification
 - Local Board meets the membership provisions of WIOA Section 107(b) and CUIA Section 14202(c)
 - Business majority, with two or more members that represent small business and an elected chair – also a business rep. (2 current vacancies)
 - 20% Workforce representatives (labor, apprenticeship, organizations serving individuals with barriers or youth)
 - Education/Training – WIOA Title II Adult Ed and Literacy and higher education reps
 - Governmental/Economic/Community Development – two economic/community development rep (1 vacant), one Wagner Peyser rep, one Department of Rehab rep.
 - Additional Members – SBDC identified, (vacant)
 - Met or Exceeded Performance Accountability Measures on at least eight of nine negotiated performance measures for 2013-2014 and 2014-2015
 - Two measures not met in 2013-2014, however, corrective action plan is already in place
 - Local Board Sustained Fiscal Integrity
 - No significant findings in audits, evaluations or reviews
 - Status updates on Key WIOA Provisions
 - Meeting new youth service requirements
 - Adhering to new Uniform Guidance requirements
 - Developing sector initiatives and career pathways in high demand industries in coordination with community colleges, apprenticeship programs, adult basic education and other training providers.
 - Adopting, implementing, and promoting the AJCC brand
 - Completing Phase I of the MOU development process.
- Recertification will be for 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 Program Years
- Recertification request will be forwarded to Board of Supervisor's for approval.
