Call to Order

Vice Chair Jim Salio called the meeting to order at 4:05 PM.

Information/Discussion/Action Items:

4.1 PY 12/13 WIA Youth Services Scope and Budget; Reva Bear reviewed the scope and budget with Goodwill Industries for Youth Services. Goodwill Industries, the One-Stop Operator for San Luis Obispo County, will subcontract with Cuesta College for the provision of WIA Youth Services. Service specifications and program outcomes for the WIA Youth fund stream include 25 new in-school youth and 45 new out-of-school youth. These numbers do not include participants carried into PY 12-13 from PY 11-12. PY 12-13 planned enrollments are consistent with the total enrollments anticipated for the current program year.

Cuesta's contract with Goodwill Industries is comprised entirely of WIA Youth funds in the amount of \$578,384. Goodwill retained approximately \$20,000 in WIA Youth funds to support its oversight, fiscal and program reporting responsibilities for WIA Youth Services. The budget is based on PY 11-12 WIA allocations.

4.2 Cuesta 2nd Quarter Report; Jennifer Kim reviewed the quarterly report through March 15, 2012. YTD: Cuesta currently has served eighteen (18) in-school youth and enrolled thirty-five (35) new in-school youth.

YTD: Cuesta currently has served eleven (11) out-of-school youth and enrolled forty (40) new out-of-school-youth.

Jennifer discussed current challenges that Youth One-Stop is having with registration of youth into the VOS system. Many youth are without social security numbers, which is needed for tracking in the system.

Many youth are having difficulties obtaining a GED due to lack of accessible means of transportation to the testing site. Currently San Luis Obispo is the only city qualified to administer

the test. Discussion centered on proposing an alternate testing site to facilitate more areas in the county. Jennifer Kirn will provide information to Jim Salio who will discuss the challenge with Dr. Julian Crocker, County Superintendent of Schools for San Luis Obispo County.

- 4.3 Grand Opening/Youth Job Fair; Jennifer Kirn shared information regarding the Youth One-Stop grand opening. The event was very successful and was covered by KCOY 12, FOX 11, SanLuisObispo Tribune and Coast News. The Youth One-Stop is currently in development with a projected working date of June 2012.

Youth Job Fairs are currently set for the Grover Beach Youth One-Stop and Paso Robles One-Stop, on Wednesday, April 25, 2012, from 5pm – 7pm. There are currently 13 employers confirmed for Paso Robles and 6 for Grover Beach. Informational flyers are available on the WIB website.

Future Agenda Items/New Business:

Dominic Santangelo asked the committee for suggestions on alternate storage of Summer Youth Program equipment. It is currently being stored by CCC. The equipment will be stored for future youth programs by the Youth One-Stop. Dominic will deliver to Jennifer Kirn an inventory list of all equipment. Monies will be set-aside from the PY 12/13 budget for storage fees.
